BUDGET VOTE


The **Library Budget Vote** is scheduled to be held on Tuesday, September 26th from 2pm until 8pm in the library Meeting Room. Greenport and Oysterponds School District registered voters are eligible to cast ballots on this year's tax appropriation. Greenport School District will contribute \$520,184 and the Oysterponds School District \$457,628. This is a decrease of about 7.5% over last year with the average homeowner paying just under \$200 per year for library service. The total planned library budget including fines, fees, interest and dividends and miscellaneous donations is \$998,653. A **Budget Information Meeting** will be held on **Monday, September 11th** at **6pm** at the library.
