



Registrations are renewed every three years with proof of street address.









Notes from the Curator



On February 12th, Abraham Lincoln's birthday, our two exhibitions featuring portrayals of the former president come to a close. For those who haven't seen these yet, "My Affair with Abraham Lincoln" is a series of 19+ expressionistic portraits of Lincoln by Roz Dimon. She created these in response to political events in the US between December 2020 and February 2021.

Running parallel and complimentary with this show is *Abraham Lincoln by Robert Berks* (1922-2011). An over-life-sized Lincoln bust is the powerful centerpiece in a display that highlights several of the notable figures sculpted by the acclaimed Orient artist.

Abraham Lincoln has been quite a presence in the library over these last few months, we'll be sorry to say goodbye.

Looking to the future, we have several exhibitions planned for later in the year, including one focused on craft. *Textile Tales* will explore the visual beauty of woven and knitted artworks, and consider the historic, social, cultural, and political stories entwined in their making.




