

While our summer exhibition *Textile Tales* closed in August, our site-specific garden installation *present* by Larissa Killough will stay in place through September.

We're also delighted that the exhibition's segment "Inside the Designer's Studio: Spotlight on Libby Payne" will remain on display until the end of October.

Libby Payne is the focus of one of the chapters of the 2018 Bloomsbury book *The Hidden History of American Fashion: Rediscovering 20th-Century Women Designers*, and her main archive collection is at the Fashion Institute of Technology in Manhattan. She was also profoundly inspired by Greenport and the North Fork.

As such, we thought it was important to spotlight the work of this creative designer of American ready-to-wear clothing for a while longer. **Keep an eye out in the October newsletter for more details on a talk by Libby's daughter Penny.**
