

An annual event highlighting the harms of censorship, Banned Books Week is supported by a coalition of organizations, including the American Library Association. In this spirit, we invite artists to create a work that addresses the importance of the freedom to read.


If you would like to participate, please pick up one of 100 book-sized, 10 x 8" canvases from the library beginning on **Saturday, Aug. 31**. Completed canvases must be returned to the library no later than **6 pm on Monday, Sept. 16**.

The exhibition opens to the public on **Saturday, Sept. 21**. Works will be for sale **by lottery** at \$100 each, with proceeds shared by the artist and the Friends of the Library. Potential buyers simply have to register their interest in a work at the library by **5 pm on Sunday, Sept. 29**. Winning buyers will be informed the following week.

All artworks will remain on display until the closing reception on Friday, Oct. 11, 6-8 pm. Any works not already sold will be available for purchase, and all buyers can pick up their purchases during (or after) the closing reception. See separate flyer for more details!
