Because not everyone can use our computers in the same way, we will be adding **Browsealoud**, a computer/web access tool, to our library computers and website. It includes text-to-speech screen reading, text magnification, screen masking, and translation for 99 languages (40 of which it can also speak). These tools will allow us to extend services to patrons experiencing a variety of challenges such as limited literacy, vision impairment, language barriers, and attention and focus disorders.

Browsealoud is available to anyone visiting the library's website. It can also be used on any of the library's public access computers with virtually any online content, including PDFs. People who have trouble using the Internet because of a variety of challenges are encouraged to visit us to see how **Browsealoud** can help.

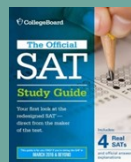

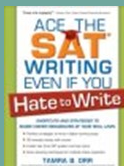

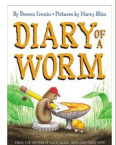
