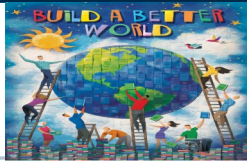

Every Wednesday morning, no matter the weather. Meet up at the library wearing your walking shoes.

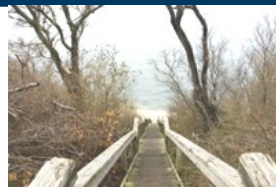
