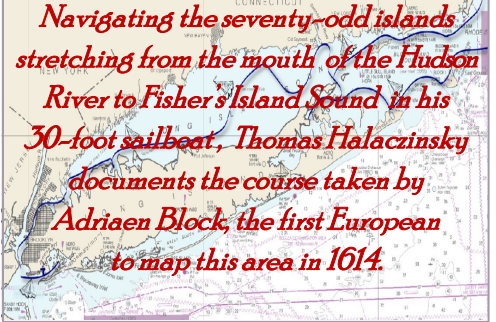

art to its rightful owners.


